

2007 Population Estimates by Ethnic Groups

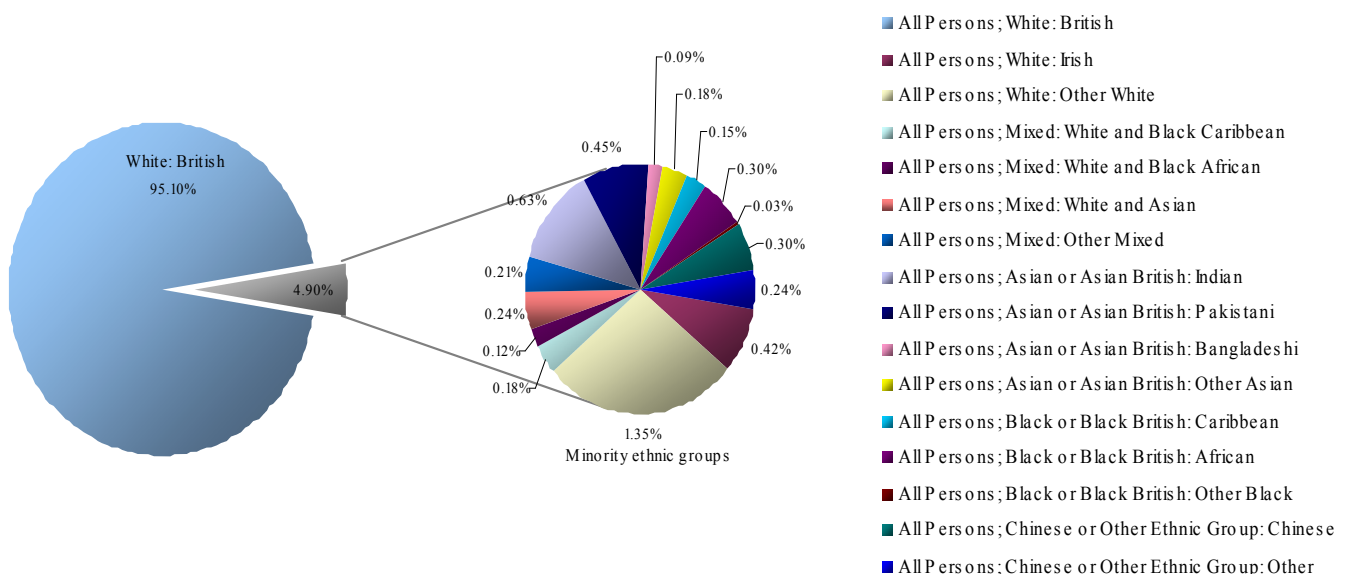
The Office for National Statistics have released experimental statistics for mid-2007 population estimates by ethnic groups for England.

Figures are in thousands. Mid-year estimates are as at April 2007. Please note that it is ONS policy to publish population estimates rounded to the nearest hundred persons.

- 95.1% of the population in East Riding is White: British. This is higher than the regional average of 88.0% and the national average of 83.6%.
- Minority ethnic groups comprise 4.9% of the population - an increase of 2.4% since the last Census in 2001.
- The White population forms 96.8% of the total population; Asian or Asian British group is the second largest group with a population of about 4,500 (1.4%).
- The largest minority ethnic group is the Other White group (an estimated 4,500 people in mid-2007).
- The largest percentage increase in the East Riding has been the Black or Black British group - their number has increased by 12.5% between mid-2006 and mid-2007.
- The White: British population comprises 97.7% of the people of retirement age.
- The number of White: British people in England and in the Yorkshire and Humber region is on the decline, mainly due to out-migration. Although the number of White: British people in the East Riding has increased, as a percentage of the local population, this represents a decrease of 0.2%.
- The number of White: British and White: Irish people is decreasing across England, both due to natural change and migration.

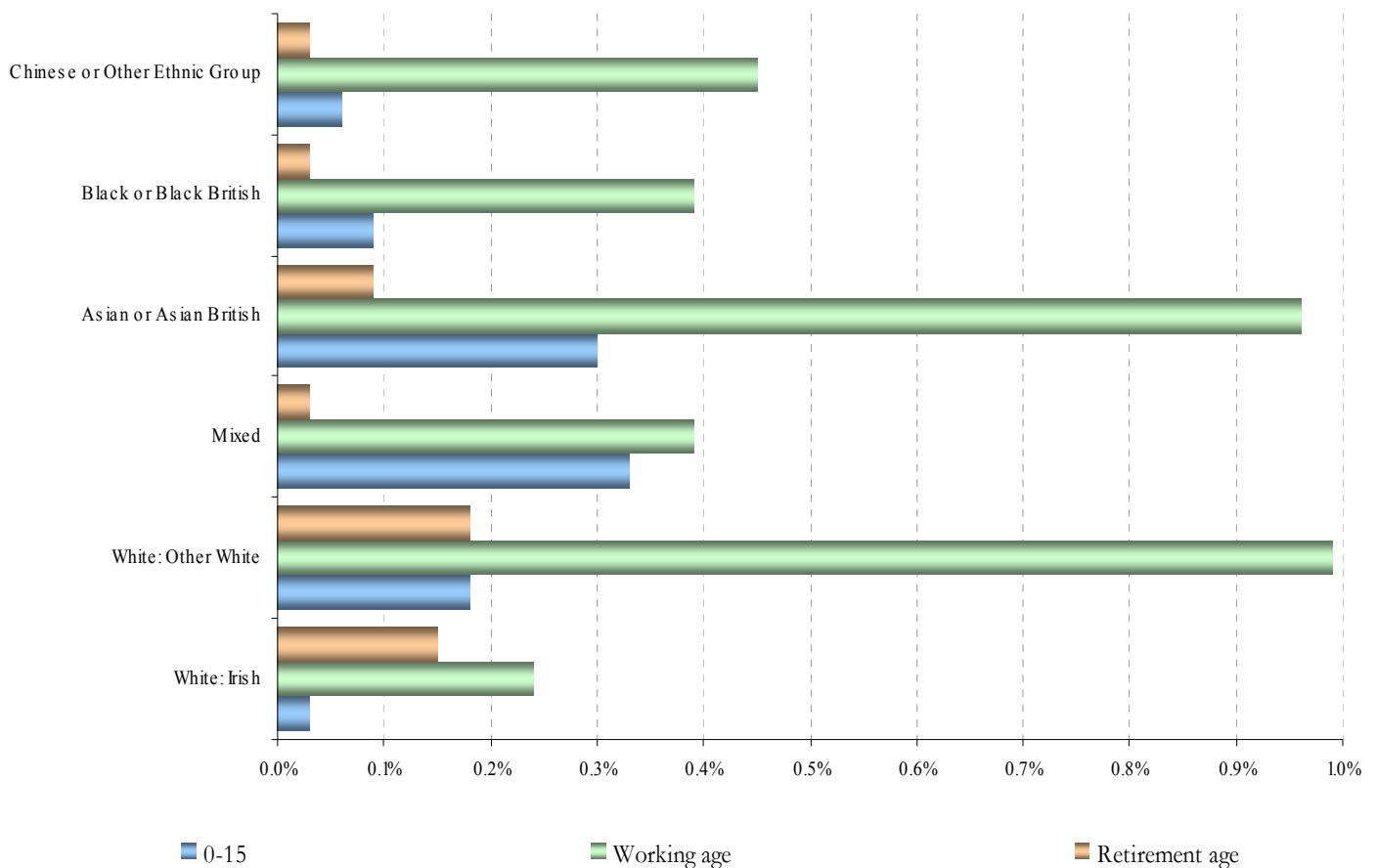
Mid- 2007 distribution of population in East Riding of Yorkshire

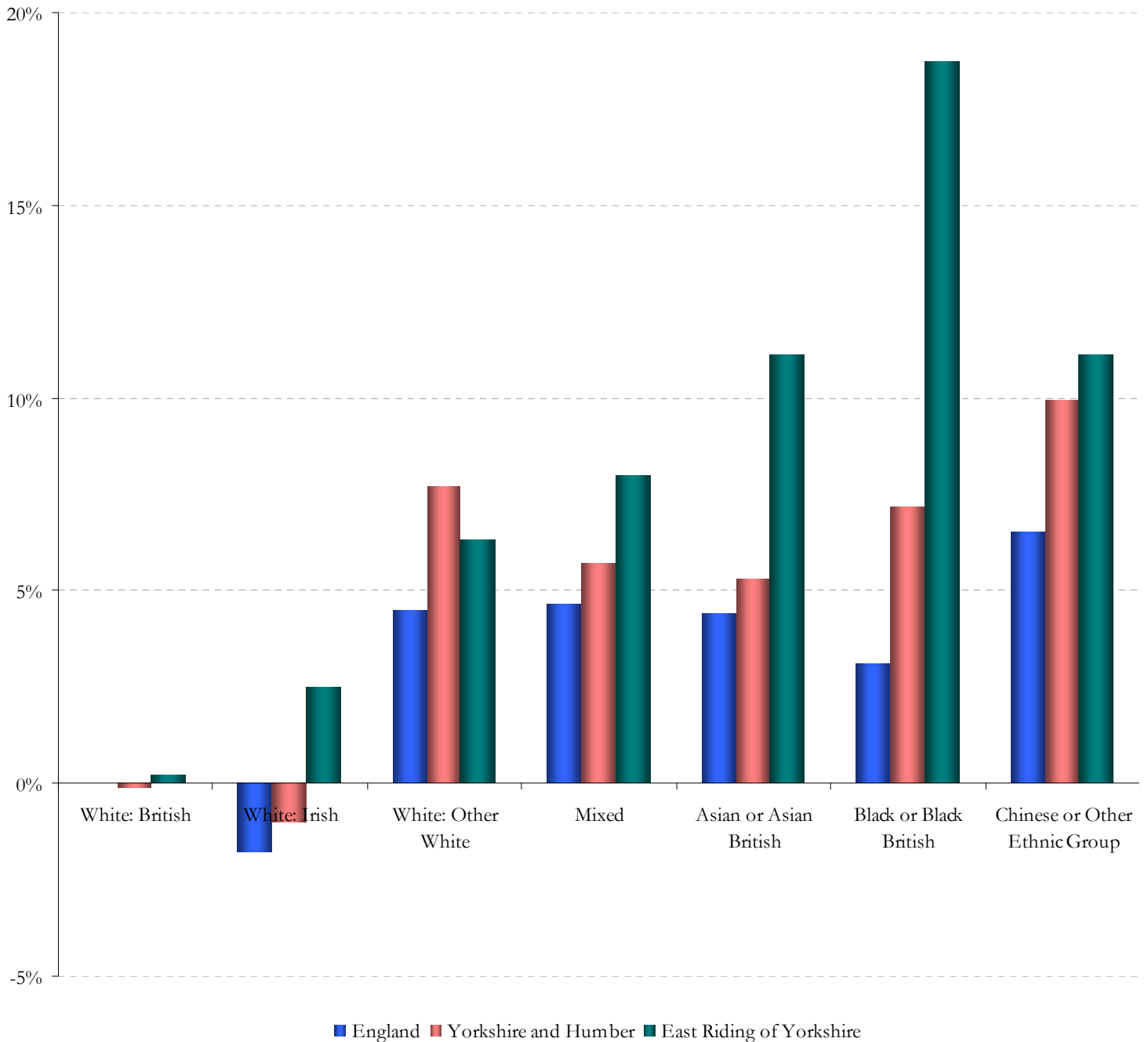
Percentage of population by broad age for minority ethnic groups

Methodology used for population estimates by ethnic group: The estimates relate to mid-year 2007 and are consistent with the Office for National Statistics' Mid-Year Population Estimates. The estimates are based on the 2001 Census, with adjustments made to reflect births, deaths and migration during each year. As the estimates have not been shown to reach the quality standards required of National Statistics, the data has been released as Experimental Statistics.

Users should note that as these datasets have been classified as 'Experimental Statistics', comments on methodology and validation are encouraged.
