#### **Plans**

- 23.—(1) An application for a premises licence under section 17 or section 34, or a club premises certificate under section 71, shall be accompanied by a plan of the premises to which the application relates and which shall comply with the following paragraphs of this regulation.
- (2) Unless the relevant licensing authority has previously agreed in writing with the applicant following a request by the applicant that an alternative scale plan is acceptable to it, in which case the plan shall be drawn in that alternative scale, the plan shall be drawn in standard scale.
  - (3) The plan shall show—
  - (a) the extent of the boundary of the building, if relevant, and any external and internal walls of the building and, if different, the perimeter of the premises;
  - (b) the location of points of access to and egress from the premises;
  - (c) if different from sub-paragraph (3)(b), the location of escape routes from the premises;
  - (d) in a case where the premises is to be used for more than one licensable activity, the area within the premises used for each activity;
  - (e) fixed structures (including furniture) or similar objects temporarily in a fixed location (but not furniture) which may impact on the ability of individuals on the premises to use exits or escape routes without impediment;
  - (f) in a case where the premises includes a stage or raised area, the location and height of each stage or area relative to the floor;
  - (g) in a case where the premises includes any steps, stairs, elevators or lifts, the location of the steps, stairs, elevators or lifts;
  - (h) in the case where the premises includes any room or rooms containing public conveniences, the location of the room or rooms;
  - (i) the location and type of any fire safety and any other safety equipment including, if applicable, marine safety equipment; and
  - (j) the location of a kitchen, if any, on the premises.
- (4) The plan may include a legend through which the matters mentioned or referred to in paragraph (3) are sufficiently illustrated by the use of symbols on the plan.

#### ADVERTISING OF APPLICATIONS - PROCESS FOR PREMISES /CLUB PREMISES CERTIFICATES

## Variation of existing licence/ New Licence

These will have to be advertised in the local press within the first ten days and a notice attached to the premises for 28 consecutive days. There are specific requirements as set out in regulations (25 and 26) issued by central government that must be met for the application to be accepted as a valid application. It is important that you comply with these requirements.

#### **Notice on or at Premises**

For a period of **no less than 28 consecutive days**, starting on the day after the day on which\_the application was given to the relevant licensing authority a **Notice must be displayed** which is: -

- Of a size equal or larger than A4
- Of a pale blue colour
- Printed legibly in black ink or typed in font of a size equal to or larger than 16 size font

<u>And in ALL CASES</u> prominently at or on the premises to which the application relates where it can be conveniently read from the exterior of the premises. In the case of a premises covering an area of more than 50 metres square, a further notice in the same form and subject to the same requirements every 50 metres along the external perimeter of the premises abutting the highway

# **Notice In Newspapers**

A notice should be published in a **local newspaper**, or, if there is none, in a **local newsletter**, **circular** or similar document, **circulating in the vicinity of the premises** on at **least one occasion**, during the **period of 10 working days** starting the day after the day on which the application was given to the **licensing authority**. It may be worth waiting until your application has been accepted as a **valid application** by the licensing authority before advertising your application. Applications will be validated within 1 working day following date of receipt by the licensing authority.

### **IMPORTANT**

In the case of a **new premises licence** or **new club premises certificate** the Notices referred to above should include a **statement of the relevant licensable activities** or **relevant qualifying club activities** which it is proposed will be carried on or from the premises.

In the case of a variation application to a premises licence or a club premises certificate the notices shall briefly describe the proposed variation.

IN ALL CASES (New/Variation) the Notices referred to above shall state: -

- The <u>name of the Applicant or club</u>
- The <u>Postal address of the premises or club premises</u>, if any, or if there is no postal address for the premises <u>a description of those premises</u> sufficient to enable the location and extent of the premises to be identified
- <u>The postal address and website address</u> where the register of the <u>licensing authority</u> is kept and where the record of the application may be inspected. This will be website address <u>www.eastriding.gov.uk</u> and the licensing authority address will be:-
