What actions are being taken? LA commented that Humberside Police were now in a much more robust position in terms of crime recording. There had been a recent change of crime registrar and the new incumbent had worked previously for HMIC which brings extra value to the work area. The Police were also specifically looking at rape in terms of crime recording and were embarking on several "mystery shopper" exercises over the next few months to improve their responsiveness.</p> <p>4) LA described the efforts being undertaken to build a "richer picture" in relation to crime profiles. This included organised crime groups, drug networks and other profiles. Colleagues noted that the East Riding does not currently have the analyst capacity that other areas in the sub region have, but there are other opportunities to build profiles which may involve performance and policy areas in the future.
