

Starting Year 7 at Secondary School in September 2021

Summary of how places have been allocated

Your child has been allocated a school place in accordance with the local authority's coordinated admissions scheme and schools' published admission arrangements.

If your child qualified for a place at one of the schools named in your application, they have been allocated a place at that school.

If your child qualified for a place at more than one school named in your application, they have been allocated a place at the school you ranked as the highest preference.

If your child has not qualified for a place at any of the schools named in your application, they have been allocated a place at either their catchment area school, if a place was available, or at the nearest school in the East Riding which is covered by the coordinated scheme and has a place available.

Allocations at Academies, Foundation Schools, Voluntary Aided Schools or those outside the East Riding

If your child has been allocated a place at an academy, foundation school, voluntary aided school, or one within another local authority area, we advise you to write to the school confirming whether you wish to accept the place, or not, within 10 working days of receipt of your allocation letter.

Appeals

You can appeal against the decision not to allocate your child a place at any of the schools named on your application form. If you do wish to appeal, please contact the School Admissions team on 01482 392100, or email schooladmissions@eastriding.gov.uk to request an appeal form and guidance notes. Completed forms should returned to the School Admissions team by 7 May 2021. Appeals are planned to be heard in June and July 2021.

Waiting Lists - East Riding of Yorkshire Schools only

For schools which are oversubscribed, waiting lists of unsuccessful applicants will be drawn up after the allocation of places. Children placed on the waiting list will be prioritised using the oversubscription criteria set out in the secondary school Guide for Parents – available online. In line with the law, in ordering the waiting list no value will be placed on the date on which the application was received or when the preference (first, second or third) was stated by parents in their application. Where we receive confirmation that places are not taken up or children in the relevant year group leave the school and pupil numbers fall below the published admission number, places will be offered to those with the highest priority on the waiting list.

If the applicant is allocated a place at the school named as their second preference, their child's name will be placed on the waiting list for the school named as first preference.

If the applicant is allocated a place at the school named as their third preference, their child's name will be placed on the waiting lists for the schools named as first and second preference.

If the applicant is not allocated a place at any of the schools listed in their application, their child's name will be placed on the waiting lists of all schools they have named in their application and their catchment area school (unless they have already been allocated a place at their catchment school).

Waiting lists will only be held for places that become available until 31 December 2021.
